WHEREAS, On June 29, 2020, the City Council declared, pursuant to Section 10.02 of the Round Rock Home Rule Charter, that a public health emergency existed in the City of Round Rock due to the COVID-19 pandemic and adopted Emergency Ordinance No. O-2020-0374 regarding face covering requirements; and

WHEREAS, the expected number of Williamson County residents fully vaccinated by the end of the month has increased to over 33% of those over the age of 65; and

WHEREAS, all three vaccines approved for Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) in the United States are available to the general public in Texas; and

WHEREAS, the sustained COVID-19 hospitalization rate in Trauma Service Area A-O) has remained at roughly 5%, with a statistically average number of hospital beds being available in Williamson County; and


WHEREAS, as a result of increase in vaccinations and a decrease in hospitalizations, the City Council desires to repeal Emergency Ordinance O-2020-0374; and
